Update on Foston School Extension

As you are aware we recently had our lovely wooden classroom put up as a temporary measure for our year 3 / 4 children with a long-term plan to make it a much-needed library and breakout space. To achieve this we have been working with North Yorkshire County Council to provide extra teaching space within the main school building.

This is a really exciting time for school as this development will provide a larger teaching space for our Y1 /2 children and also allow for a dedicated EYFS classroom with additional toilets. The two classrooms will also be able to open up the two classrooms to make one hall, large enough for children to eat together and to hold assemblies in etc.

The additional space is not intended to increase the size of the school but intended to give pupils and staff the additional space and facilities Foston has always needed.

We hope works will start on this extension during the summer holidays under a permitted build due to the need for additional space in school. Also, we are currently working out how the building work can happen without significant impact to the normal running of the school. We will keep you updated when we have further information and are able to share further arrangements.

With this in mind we have asked our Parents and Friends group to focus their fund raising this year on developing our wooden classroom into a library and small group work space for our children.

Parking Outside School

We have recently had a number of concerns raised from parents and the wider community with regards to parking at school. In addition, we have been made aware of near miss outside of the school involving vehicles. This is a common issue at most schools and as a result the Governors are currently working with the Highways Agency and the Village Parish Council to ascertain if there is anything that can done to improve the situation.

To address the issues raised we also need your help. If you need to drive to school, please action the following...

- Take advantage of the staggered pick up and drop off times (morning 8.45 until 9 am / afternoon 3.15 until 3.20).
- Park safely ensuring not to block the footpaths/pavements or parking on verges.
- Once parked, switch of your engine.
- Park further up in the village where quieter and walk down to the school site.
- Be extremely vigilant when driving near the school site, giving priority to pedestrians.
