We had a group scavenger hunt, looking for specific materials in everyday objects, and had lots of fun with this. We even challenged ourselves to look for objects that are made from more than one material!




## **News from Class 3**

This week, children in Class 3 have enjoyed learning about place value. The children have been recognising the value of each digit and making numbers using base 10.



We also enjoyed learning about the life and legacy of Queen Elizabeth II. The children then created digital pop art in the style of Andy Warhol and wrote about her life.



## News from Class 4

We have been hard at work this week, planning and writing a free-verse poem in English. In maths, we have been using concrete and pictorial methods to represent our numbers up to 1 million.

We also started our new history topic on pre-historic Britain and have been exploring the origin of how humans came to live in Britain.



# **Murton Park visit at Stillington**

On the morning of Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> of September, our KS2 classes will be travelling to Stillington Primary school. A team from Murton Park will be talking to us about what life was like in pre-historic Britain. We will also be able to handle some replica artefacts from that era. Children from Terrington and St Hilda's CE schools will also be joining us for this talk.

# Changes to how we teach Reading

In line with updated government guidance, we have recently purchased a new reading scheme called 'Little Wandle Letters and Sounds'. Little Wandle Letters and Sounds is a systematic, synthetic phonics (SSP) programme.

We teach phonics to children in Reception and Key Stage One daily. One of the changes is that the order in which we teach sounds to the children has changed slightly.

#### **Support for Parents**

In particular, notice how the children don't add an 'uh' sound at the end, so they say: 't' not 'tuh'. There is also information about how to help your child remember how to write their letters and say their sounds.

#### Reception & Year 1: Reading Practice in school

Children in Reception and Year 1 have reading practice sessions twice a week, when they will read the same book. The first time we work on decoding (sounding out) the words and the second time we work on prosody (the patterns of stress and intonation), reading with expression, and comprehension. We read the books twice at school because we want to develop the fluency.

The more they see words, the quicker they begin to read them automatically without having to sound them out.

#### A Reading Practice Book – Collins Big Cat range

The following week the children will then take home the book they have read twice in their reading practice sessions to read at home. Books are in colour bands and are carefully matched to your child's current reading level. If your child is reading it with very little help, please don't worry that it's too easy – your child needs to develop fluency and confidence in reading. Listen as they read the book. Remember to give them lots of praise – celebrate their success! If they can't read a word, read it to them. After they have finished, talk about the book together.



We recommend that children read for **5-10 minutes each night**. Please record this reading session in your child's planner.

## Year 2: Changes to how we teach Reading

Children will continue reading the Big Cat books in Year 2 until they are secure in their knowledge of Phase 5 phonics and are reading these books fluently. They will then move onto turquoise banded books to read at home. Please make sure either you or your child writes in their planner each time they read.

We recommend that children read for 10 minutes or longer each night.

# **Parents' Evenings**

We would like to trial having one longer parents' evening in the autumn term rather than a choice of two nights. Details for this year are as follows:

**Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> October 3.45-7pm:** Main parents' evening and settling in discussion (where applicable) for Nursery & Reception, Years 1 & 3

Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> November 3.45-7pm: Main parents' evening for Years 2, 4, 5 & 6

Spring term: Choice of two dates:

Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> March 3.30-5.30pm OR Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> March 5-7pm (all children)

Parents can choose to have a face-to-face meeting or a telephone conversation on each occasion. Appointments will be arranged by the office staff in the usual way.

### **Sporting Competitions:**

We are very lucky to have made links with Malton School Primary School Partnership this year.

All children from Years 1 – 6 will have the opportunity to take part in the different events, which will be held on various Wednesday afternoons across the year. Children should come to school in PE kit on these days. On the day, your child will be taken from school on a bus and will be returned before the end of the school day. There may be times when your child/ children will be late as the bus may have to drop off at one of our other schools first.

For each competition, we will take **all children** in the specified year groups, not just the children chosen for the teams.

On Wednesday September 21st, we will participate in a KS2 football competition.

As the children will be at Stillington in the morning, they will have lunch there and travel to Malton afterwards. The bus will return children to their own school for around the usual pick-up time.

If there are any changes to this fixture list, you will be notified on the school bulletin or by email.



Our first football & dodgeball extra curricular-clubs took place this week. These clubs will support children in preparing for our sports competitions this term. **There are still a few places left**—please email the office to book your child in.

# **Reception Baseline Assessment**

Next week, the children in Reception will be completing the government's Reception Baseline Assessment. The baseline is a short, interactive and practical assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematical skills to help inform our teaching. This is **not** something they need to prepare for in anyway and most children won't even realise they are even doing it!
