We have had a great time this week. We are currently learning about making healthy choices and through this we planned, designed and made our own fruit salads. We loved looking at all the different colours and textures.




<u>Year 3 & 4</u>

Operation Encompass Partnership

We wanted to take a moment to share with you information about a program we are implementing at our school called Operation Encompass.

Operation Encompass is a police and education early intervention safeguarding partnership that supports children and young people who have been exposed to domestic abuse. The program aims to ensure that schools are better equipped to support students who may be experiencing domestic abuse at home, by providing timely and relevant information to key adults within the school, with the consent of the child's parent or carer.

The program works by the police contacting the school's Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) before 9am on the next school day following an incident of domestic abuse where a child was present, or aware of the incident. The DSL will then ensure that appropriate support is made available to the child or young person. This could include arranging for additional support from a school counsellor or providing a safe place for the child to talk about their experience.

The aim of Operation Encompass is to make sure that children and young people who have experienced domestic abuse are able to receive the support they need to cope and recover, and to ensure that their education is not affected by their experiences at home.

We are committed to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all our students, and we believe that Operation Encompass will help us to provide the best possible support to those who may be experiencing domestic abuse.
