


Years 3 & 4

Sports Enhancement Day Reminder

Due to the busyness of drop off and collection please can we ask that this is done swiftly to allow others to park, we have limited parking spaces, some parents are having to park their cars on the road making drop off and collection unsafe. The school gate will be locked at 9am, please can you ensure you have departed the school grounds— If it is after 9am you will be asked to use the back gate.

This will give you the opportunity to look at the children's books before parents' evening the following week. We look forward to seeing you in school to celebrate the children's learning. Parents' evening appointments are now available.

School Meal Price Increase

Governors have chosen not to increase the price of a school meal for as long as possible in order to support our families, but unfortunately due to rising costs and budget constraints they have made the difficult decision to gradually increase the price. The first rise will to £2.75 per meal from 18th April, and then we anticipate that they will need to rise again to the region of £3.00 in September, in line with the increased catering charges.

We understand that this may cause some inconvenience and frustration for families, and we want to assure you that as a group of small schools we have worked hard to keep the costs down, and will continue to do so.

If you get certain benefits, your child could qualify for free school meals during all school years, even if they already receive the Universal Infant Free School Meals (for Reception/Year 1 & Year 2 pupils) it may be worth applying as they could then continue to receive them from Year 3. To qualify you must be receiving:

- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods (£616.67 per month)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under part six of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)

Working Tax Credit run-on, paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Please note that contributions-based benefits, including contribution-related Jobseekers' Allowance do not entitle you to claim free school meals. To check please go to: https://www.northyorks.gov.uk/free-school-meals
