## **FOSTON PRIMARY SCHOOL BULLETIN**

#### **Nursery & Reception**

This week the children in Nursery and Reception have loved exploring nature in our outdoor area on the field recently and were really excited to find a toad! The children then hunted around for different Minibeasts under the logs talking about the habitats of different animals. "They like to live under logs". The children then tried to create their own habitat for the animals, considering what they look like and need to survive. This led beautifully into conversations around lifecycles of frogs/ toads. "Tadpoles grow into little baby frogs or baby toads and then they grow into mummies or daddies, frogspawn turns into tadpoles".





#### Year 1 & 2

We have been exploring mass this week as part of our topic on measurements. The children have really enjoyed this topic and it's allowed them to really get involved with their learning. This week they used their knowledge of mass to make biscuits, something that they were really successful at.





#### Year 3 & 4

We have been learning and consolidating our knowledge of measurement, specifically capacity in Class 3. The children used their knowledge of millilitres and litres to estimate, measure and compare capacity. They could identify the difference between capacity and volume using this to solve simple capacity problems. The year 4 also converted measurements when necessary.





#### Year 5 & 6

This week in Class 4 it was our year 5's turn to go to Malton for a transition visit. They had great fun burning different chemicals in Science, making key rings and even acting out a scene from The Lion King. Back in school we have been practising our songs for our play as well as adding in some movements and acting in our scenes.

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#### **Transition Days**

On Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> July and Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> July, we will be holding transition days in school, where the children will have a day in their new classes, and for some, their new teachers. The teachers will be leading fun 'get to know you' activities.

For one of our transition day activities, Mrs Richmond and Mrs Scaife ask for the new year 1 children (reception) and new year 2 children (year 1) to bring an item/picture that is special to them to share with the class.


