## Nursery & Reception

The children in Nursery and Reception enjoyed our first drama session of the school year with our drama teacher, Audrie. The children were excited to show her their new classroom as well. It was great to see the children listening and expressing themselves through movement. The Reception children have made a super start to their phonics, learning new sounds. Please use the information sheets sent home each week to support your child at home.



#### <u>Year 1 & 2</u>

In DT we have been exploring a range of toys that use sliders or levers. The children are able to distinguish between two types of mechanisms. We have also been looking at pivot points of the leavers.

In maths, we have been discussing compare using the stem sentences; greater than, less than and equal to. The children have used maths equipment to create numbers in different ways to compare. They could identify tens and ones in a variety of numbers.



## <u>Year 3 & 4</u>

Year 3/4 have been preparing to write newspaper reports in our English lessons about the moon landing and the first man on the moon! We looked at a range of newspapers to explore how they are written!



#### <u>Year 5 & 6</u>

On Tuesday our Year 5/6 children took part in some very important training for leading some of our collective worships in school. The training was delivered by Picture News, who provide us with a current news story each week including an image, a thought-provoking question and a variety of teaching resources. The children learnt how to plan for an act of worship and how to deliver this to the whole school should they choose to do so. We listened to lots of ideas both from the creators of Picture News and pupils who are already involved in leading worship in their schools.


