Nursery & Reception

This week in Nursery and Reception the children have enjoyed reading our new literacy key text, 'What the Ladybird Heard'. The children loved walking around pretending to be the ladybird thinking about – what would the ladybird hear at Foston School? We found that the ladybird heard birds, cars, vans, music, crunching ice, the squeaky gate, crunchy leaves and children talking. The children in Reception then had a go at writing what the ladybird heard into speech bubbles.



<u>Year 1 & 2</u>

Class 2 have been enjoying their new Geography topic of Brazil, we have been locating Brazil on a map, looking at features of Brazil in particular the Christ the Redeemer statue. We will be looking at the city of Rio De Janeiro and comparing it to where we live in the next few weeks.




<u>Year 3 & 4</u>

Class 2 designed their own experiment to measure how different surfaces can affect objects and forces. We used wood, sand, rocks, water and leaves and measured the distance that it rolled down a ramp. We found that friction, air and water resistance affects how a objects moves on a surface.



<u>Year 5 & 6</u>

This week in Class 4 we have been investigating levers and linkages in DT. In science we have been asking some big questions about forces and gravity and doing lots of practical experiments and recording our data.
