Nursery and Reception

This week in Nursery and Reception we have been continuing our learning about Spring. We have been learning the names of the different parts of a plant and even had a go at doing our own bit of gardening. The children were very helpful at filling up our tyre planters with soil before adding some seeds. They were amazed at how small the seeds were! We have also continued exploring

Year 1 & 2

We have had a very busy week in Class 2! We have enjoyed our first aid training, we learned how to call for help, apply a plaster and to turn someone on their side to enable them to breathe if they are unresponsive. We discussed learning our home address in case we need to ever call for help. The first aid trainer gave us an activity booklet that you can fill in at home and discuss basic first aid with your child.

We joined an online live lesson about the importance of water around the world, this links to our English story "Zahra" about a little girl who walks miles daily to get water for her family.

We have also been excited to see our rainforests in a jar growing, we discussed how placing our jars near the sun and spraying them with water to create rain have allowed them to grow. We predicted what might happen in the jars during the Easter holidays.

The spring term has gone very quickly! Class 3 have displayed great dedication this term to their class work and had a lovely Easter Service to close the term at the local church. We were also lucky to have 'Smile Rooms' to visit us and talk to us about dental hygiene. They showed us different fizzy drinks and we were shocked about how much sugar they contained! We talked about the importance of looking after our teeth.

This week in Class 4 we have been using some exciting vocabulary to create atmosphere in part of a story. But not just any story. A terrifying story about stairs leading to a place as black as midnight that is filled with...suspense.

Our year 6's have worked very hard and completed another set of SATS practise papers - well done!

We also really enjoyed our First Aid sessions and even managed to make some 'blood' (pictured, believe it or not!) Finally, we have been learning about time zones which will coincide nicely with anyone going abroad this holiday.


